



Corner to Corner Crochet Rug in Jumbo



Corner to Corner crochet is a wonderful way to create a rug. You can decide how thick and chunky or fine, you want your rug to be...just use a crochet hook size appropriate to the yarn you choose.

You can decide how big you want your rug to be. You just need to keep increasing until you think it is big enough...then decrease to match.

If you have a set number of balls in your stash or budget, then simply increase until slightly less than half is used, and use the other half to decrease back to the beginning. You will have to allow extra if you want to add some tassels or a border.

We have completed our Corner to Corner rug in Panda's Jumbo – a bulky yarn that works up quickly.

This is a free pattern in a variety of places on the internet. Written instructions can be confusing...the video I am suggesting you link to is one that we found the easiest to follow:

The quantities and hook size below only related to our rug completed in Jumbo.

You Will Need

- 10.00 mm crochet hook
- a jumbo sized sewing up need to darn in the ends!
- 18 – 20 balls of Jumbo by Panda.

Our rug measures: 150cm x 150cm

We used 18 balls of Jumbo for the rug plus 1 additional ball of Charcoal and Cream for the tassels

Panda JUMBO	Colour 1 (C1)	Colour 2 (C2)	Colour 3 (C3)	Colour 4 (C4)	Colour 5 (C5)	Colour 6 (C6)
100gm balls	2 balls Plus 1 for tassels	2 balls	3 balls	4 balls	4 balls	3 balls Plus 1 for tassels
Shades we used:	214 Charcoal	214 Brick	208 Mustard	210 Dust	Fawn 754	202 Cream

First part of pattern – increase rows. Change colours as follows:

- C1 9 rows
- C2 5 rows
- C3 4 rows
- C4 4 rows
- C5 5 rows
- C6 2 rows

You are now halfway...decrease rows now commence. Change colours as follows:

- C6 2 rows
- C5 5 rows
- C4 4 rows
- C3 4 rows
- C2 5 rows
- C1 9 rows

Finish off! Darn in ends and make and attach tassels if required.

Corner to Corner Crochet Rug in Jumbo v.15

How to make your Tassels:

You Will Need

a firm piece of cardboard – about 20cm length x 15cm wide
sharp scissors
4 elastic bands
Jumbo size sewing needle

1. Wind yarn, lengthwise around your piece of cardboard about 55 times. Cut yarn at the same end you started from so that bottom edge of cardboard has both ends of the yarn.

Cut a separate piece of yarn, approx. 30cm long and thread under the wraps so that all strands are captured.



2. Pull yarn to top of cardboard and tie firmly. Then, using sharp scissors, cut strands through on the bottom edge.



3. Place an elastic band around top of tassel to hold in place. Then take a separate piece of yarn (about 30cm) and tie firmly on top of elastic band. I usually tie and knot. Thread one end of this yarn and thread back through tassel so it forms part of the tassel (it will be longer but can be trimmed later).



4. With the other end, wrap around until band is completely covered and tassel is firm. Thread needle with yarn and take under wraps and up through the middle of the tassel.



You will now have 3 thread coming out the top of your tassel. Use these strands to tie securely on to a corner of your rug, then thread long strands back through the tassel.

Trim tassel.
